Re: Prom Points 2018

I am certain that your sons/daughters have already been discussing their Prom. You may be aware we operate a Prom Point event that runs throughout the Spring half-term from Christmas to Easter. The event aims to incentivise those students who may be not be focussing on their studies to do so, whilst recognising and rewarding those students who always work hard and aim to be the best they can be.

This year we have altered the system that we used last year, this year all students are given 20 prom points and they require 20 point to be able to purchase a prom ticket. In effect this means that all students are invited and are in a position to attend the prom

If students complete academic tasks, such the completion of practice exam questions, the submission of coursework etc then they will gain prom points. These points will enable them to win free prom tickets, fortnightly prizes and discounts from local retailers. The more points a student gains the more rewards they can potentially gain.

If a student fails to complete work to the required standard, or fail to complete coursework then may lose a prom point. At the same time, they will asked to complete the task and correct this by a deadline. If this is done then they earn back their lost point. A student may also prom points for significant behavioural issues, especially those that impact on the learning of others.

Each student will be able to track their total in ClassCharts and I shall be contacting you again at February half term with a summary of where your son/daughter is with their points.

Our intention is that every student attends the prom, which is always a fabulous event. Our aim is to reassure each student that if they make good choices, not only will they go and but also be recognised for their positive attitude.
